# Why is your name "Latine" and not "Latino"?

Part of our group's mission is to ensure inclusivity for all. The term "Latino" in Spanish is a masculine word used to describe people of Latin America heritage. Although recently we have seen the emergence of the term "Latinx", the use of an "x" is inconsistent with the Spanish language, both grammatically and orally. "Latine" is an inclusive term that encompasses individuals of all genders, and it is consistent with Spanish. An "e" can be added to most gendered words in Spanish to ensure inclusivity.

#### How often do you have events?

We will be having at least one event per month. Some months we will be having more if they are months in which important Latine celebrations occur (ex. Latine heritage month, Did de los Muertos, Christmas, etc).
