ACA: Past, Present, and Future of Obamacare COURSE SYLLABUS

REQUIRED MATERIALS

COURSE OBJECTIVES

The purpose of this course is to provide a comprehensive overview of recent health care reform. It offers an introduction to the Affordable Care Act (ACA), its implementation, and options to replace and/or supplement that legislation. Students will discuss not only law but also political and/or institutional factors that influence the operation, enforcement, and/or further development of modern health reform. It also looks forward to reforms intended to replace the ACA.

Students will:

- Be conversant in health law terminology
- Identify and know where to access health laws and regulations
- Explain sources of health coverage and care
- Articulate the major provisions of the ACA
- Analyze ACA implementation
- Discuss and propose next steps in repealing, replacing, or reforming the ACA

The syllabus is subject to change at the professor's discretion.

- Complete any coursework assigned prior to class
- Attend class. The condensed structure of the course makes attendance essential. If absence is unavoidable, email the instructor prior to the class providing the reason for the absence. Make-up work may be assigned. An unexcused absence will adversely impact a student's final grade.

Day 1: Basics—Health Policy and ACA Passage
