Dear partners,

The Faculty of Law, University of Bergen has had the tradition to hold an international day fair every year in January over the past 13 years! During this day, Law students are given as much inspiration and information as possible about study abroad opportunities before the internal application deadline in February. Over the years, the key success to this event has undoubtfully been the contribution from representatives from our partner faculties who have come to Bergen to promote their university.

Given the challenging times the entire world is currently facing, we have no choice this year but going virtual! We have therefore the pleasure of inviting you to participate in our *Virtual Study Abroad Fair 2021*.

Presentation of your university and your law program

The event will be conducted in Zoom, in which we hope each participating university will be able to give a short presentation (5-10 min) of their Law studies.

As we do not know at present how many of you will respond, we are currently only suggesting different time slots and hope you can indicate when you may be available. As soon as we have an overview, we will set up a schedule and let you know when your presentation will be. Presentations will be grouped in different sections of maximum 1 hour, and each section will end with Q&As. Hence, we are asking you to be available for up to 1 hour, to answer questions in the end.

Please note that should the response in participation be too high, we might have to make a final selection of the universities who will get to present themselves during the available time slots.

Digital stands

We are also looking into the possibility of setting up separate rooms for you to have a "digital stand" and be available for more individual questions from interested students (to be confirmed, depending on the participation response and technical capacity at our end).

Separate events

In case you would instead like to organize your own information session during that week on a separate platform, please let us know and we will be happy to share information about your event with our students. Please note however that we recommend that the timing of such an event should not collide with the students' teaching schedule or our virtual fair.

Further information

We hope you will join us virtually to present your university and your study program to our law students. This way, our students will get a unique possibility to get first-hand information about various study abroad destinations, and you will help us motivate our students to go abroad.

We will send information about the final schedule before Christmas, and instructions about the technical details will follow in January.
