

Immunization Clinic Safety During COVID-19

To ensure your immunization clinics are safe, Homeland Health Specialists will follow CDC guidelines for safely providing vaccinations during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Homeland Health Specialists will take the following steps:

- Vaccinated: All staff are fully vaccinated against COVID-19 and Influenza.
- **Daily Symptom Checks for Staff:** All staff are screened daily for symptoms of COVID-19 and contact with persons with possible COVID-19 infections.
- Wearing Appropriate PPE: All staff will wear face masks. Nurses will wear gloves and use proper hand hygiene between each participant.
- Frequent Cleaning: Surface decontamination will be completed.

The following are steps recommended for organizers and participants:

- Perform COVID-19 Symptom Checks: Participants should not attend an onsite flu clinic
 if they are exhibiting any symptoms of COVID-19, or if they had close contact with
 someone with symptoms.
- **Encourage Pre-registration:** Utilize on-line registration for appointment times to reduce crowding.
- **Complete Forms in Advance:** Encourage participants to complete their forms prior to arrival at the clinic. Remember to fill forms legibly and completely.
- Allow for Physical Distancing: Select a space to hold the clinic that is large enough to
 ensure a minimum distance of 6 feet between participants as they wait.
- "One-Way" Clinic Flow: Direct clinic flow utilizing signs, ropes, floor markings and other measures to direct participant traffic and ensure physical distancing.
- Wear a Mask: Participants should wear a face mask covering their nose and mouth
 while attending the flu clinic. Homeland Health Specialists staff will provide masks for
 participants who arrive without one.
