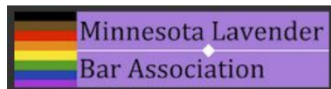

TCDIP 1L Clerkship

For over a decade, the TCDIP 1L Clerkship has helped launch the careers of law students of color in the Twin Cities. We strengthen the legal talent pipeline with strategic partnerships between TCDIP Members from law firms and corporate legal departments. Each summer, clerks spend 4-6 weeks each with a law firm and a corporate legal department. TCDIP 1L Clerks benefit from a full suite of supportive programming, including mentorship opportunities, professional development training, and professional coaching sessions.

Minnesota Minority Recruitment Conference (MMRC)

MMRC is where Twin Cities legal employers interview students of color for summer associate or post-graduation employment. The main event is a full day of virtual interviews. All employers are invited to participate, including small, medium, and large firms; corporate legal departments; and public interest, nonprofit, and government entities. Students can also choose to participate in resume review, where they'll receive feedback from attorneys and legal recruiting professionals in the Twin Cities.

1L Diversity Clerkship

The HCBA 1L Diversity Clerkship Program first began in the fall of 2005 under the direction of the Minnesota State Bar Association. The program places first-year law students from marginalized and underrepresented backgrounds with Minnesota legal employers for a full-time, paid summer associate experience. Ultimately, the program hopes to find its participants becoming future partners and leaders in

Minnesota's legal community. For the 2021 – 2022 year, the RCBA Diversity Committee partnered with the HCBA Diversity and Inclusion Committee to support these efforts.

The 2022 summer was the program's sixteenth year, and more than 45 students applied, and 21 students were placed. Hundreds of law students from underrepresented backgrounds have been served by the program since its inception.

In the spring, the [Ramsey County Bar Foundation](#) and [Hennepin County Bar Foundation](#) will award up to \$12,000 in various scholarship funds to law students who attend a Minnesota law school and who are a member of a group(s) traditionally under-represented and/or marginalized in the legal profession (including race, ethnicity, national origin, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or disability) and who contributes meaningfully to diversity in their community.

The applicant must be a current Minnesota law school and applicants will be chosen based on resume (record of academic and professional achievement, leadership qualities through past work experience, community involvement and student activities) and responses to 2 prompts focused on career growth and diversity.
